Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP)

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was initiated at the First Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting (CHOGM) for Asia Pacific Region held in Sydney in February 1978. It was officially launched on 7th September 1980 at the 2nd CHOGRM in New Delhi, India to signify Malaysia's commitment to South-South Cooperation, in particular Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC).

The MTCP emphasises the development of human resources through the provision of training in various areas which is essential for a country's development. These areas include diplomacy and diplomatic practices, economy, good governance, education, tourism, environment, social development, halal industry, safety and security as well as technology, among others. Todate, more than 37,000 participants from 144 recipient countries have benefited from the various programmes offered under the MTCP. For more information, please visit:

Course Background

SheTECH (Shaping Technology Leadership for Women in TVET) addresses the gender imbalance in Technical and Vocational Education and Training (TVET) leadership globally. This program empowers women in TVET through targeted modules, fostering skills, confidence, and knowledge in technology-related disciplines. Aligned with Sustainable Development Goals 4 and 5, SheTECH promotes gender equality and inclusive education, contributing to workplace diversity and innovation.

Course Objectives

Develop technology leadership skills and confidence among women in TVET fields, preparing them for leadership roles in technology-related industries.

Apply latest technology tools in practicing TVET technology leadership in the field of artificial intelligence, data analytics, and digital transformation.

Create valuable networking with other TVET women in technology leadership.

Eligibility

- Women enrolled in TVET programs or
- · Women TVET educators/administrators or
- Employers/industry leaders interested in promoting gender diversity skill and performances background at TVET agencies.
- Participants from Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) countries
- Have a good command of spoken and written English.
- · Ability to work independently and in group.
- Participants shall conduct themselves at all times in a manner compatible with their responsibilities as MTCP participants and abide by the laws, rules and regulations, as may be stipulated by the host government in respect of this training course.
- Participants should be appropriately dressed during the conduct of the programme.

Visa and Vaccination

- All participants must enter Malaysia with Visa With Reference (VWR). Participants for the programme will receive a copy of the approval letter from Universiti Tun Hussein Onn Malaysia. Participants are required to obtain the VWR stamping from the nearest Malaysian Embassy/ High Commission. Participants are required to be vaccinated for Covid-19 prior to arriving in Malaysia.
- Participants from countries listed in https://www.imi.gov.my/index.php/en/main-services/visa/visa-requirement-by-country/ are required to take mandatory vaccination for Yellow Fever at least ten (10) days prior to their departure to Malaysia. Yellow Fever Vaccination certificate is required upon landing in Malaysia.

Application and Enquiries

- Applications should be made using the prescribed MTCP forms available through https://mtcp.kln.gov.my/
- MTCP application forms can also be obtained from the nearest Malaysian Embassy / High Commission in MTCP recipient countries. Submitted application forms must be accompanied by the following documents:
 - Copy of Passport (all coloured pages including blank pages, front & back cover)
 - ii. 2 copies Passport sized photo (3.5cm x 5cm) (White background)
 - iii. 6 months passport validity
 - iv. Medical Report (with clinic's official seal)
- All application forms must be duly completed and endorsed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of candidates' respective countries and should be submitted only through the diplomatic channel via Malaysian Embassy/ High Commission of Malaysia.
- Successful candidates will be duly notified by Universiti Tun Hussein Onn Malaysia one (1) month before the commencement of the course.
- Incomplete and/or unendorsed forms will not be considered.
